

<u>APPLY FOR DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD ARRIVAL (DACA)</u> <u>FOR THE FIRST TIME</u>

Due to a federal judicial order issued on December 4, 2020, USCIS is once again accepting initial applications for DACA. If you have never had DACA and are eligible, you can now apply.

DACA recipients currently receive employment authorization and protection from deportation for two years. These protections can be renewed every two years.

In order to apply, you will need the following documents:

- 1. Identity documents: Birth Certificate, Passport or Consular ID, or school ID
- 2. Proof of entry to the U.S. before your 16th birthday
- 3. Proof of presence in the U.S. on or around June 15, 2012
- 4. Documents supporting that you meet the educational requirement (HS diploma, current transcript, certificates demonstrating completion of courses, etc.)
- 5. Proof of continuous presence in the U.S. since June 15, 2007 until the present
- 6. \$495 money order or check made payable to U.S. Department of Homeland Security
- 7. 2 Passport photos

This informational packet will help guide you in collecting the documents and information necessary to complete your DACA application. It is very important to complete the address worksheet and continuous presence document list to help facilitate the preparation of your application.
